

CITROEN CX 1976 - 1982

The CX is a automobile produced by the French manufacturer Citroen, it was produced from 1974 to 1991. In the 16 years that the car was produced Citroen sold 1.2 million CXs. The CX was voted the European Car of the year in 1975, it was considered by enthusiasts of being the last real car before Peugeot took over the company in 1974. Available models for that time was the four-door fastback, a estate, and a long wheelbase built on the break chassis. The CX used Citroen's unique hydro pneumatic self-levelling suspension system.

CITROEN CX 1982 - 1985

The 1982 Citroen CX was considered to be a drivers car, the suspension and steering is beyond description, the CX, with it's soft ride, big interior and a large windscreen is ideal for long travels. Some of the Citroen CX models were fitted with a 3 speed automatic gearbox, witch made the engine work at high revs when the car was going at highway speed. The CX featured one of the advanced design features of it's time, the driving experience with a Citroen CX was described to be like hovering over road irregularities.

CITROEN CX 1985 - 1989

The 1985 model suffered some design changes and became known as the Series 2, the model lost some of its previous distinctiveness. Certain models got the suspension stiffened, the most notable exterior changes were plastic bumpers giving a more aggressive exterior look, as opposed to the more elegant series 1 design. The dashboard lost the revolving drum speedometer and received a sloping center dash area. The CX was frequently used as an ambulance and a camera car, due to its high-performance soft suspension.
